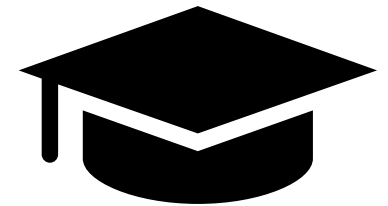

Younger than 22 years of age

Make sure the child/youth is **younger than 22** years of age.



Entitled to Free Public Education

Make sure the child/youth has:

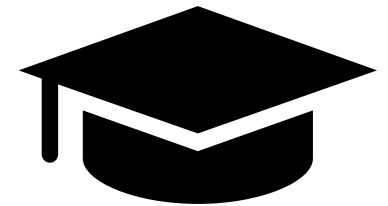
NOT graduated from high school;

NOT earned a GED.

The child must still be eligible for free and public education in the State.

What is a Qualifying Move?



A move made under the following conditions:

- due to economic necessity,
- from one residence to another,
- from one school district to another, and
- within the past 36 months





Qualifying Moves

The Migratory Child's and the Migratory Qualifying Worker's moves...

“As”, “With”,
“To-join” or
“precede” the
Migratory
Qualifying
Worker

- The Migratory Child moved “**as**” the Migratory Qualifying Worker
- The Migratory Child moved “**with**” the Migratory Qualifying Worker.
- The Migratory Child moved “**to join**” or “**precede**” the Migratory Qualifying Worker.

Migratory Qualifying Worker

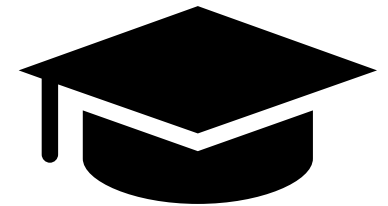


An individual who made a Qualifying Move and, soon after the move, engaged in new Qualifying Work.

Is Josue a Migratory Child?

During this time, Josue lives with the grandmother in New Orleans because there is no other place for him to stay. In August 2020, the father moves back to Monroe and Josue moves back to Monroe to live with him.

Is Maria a Migratory Child?

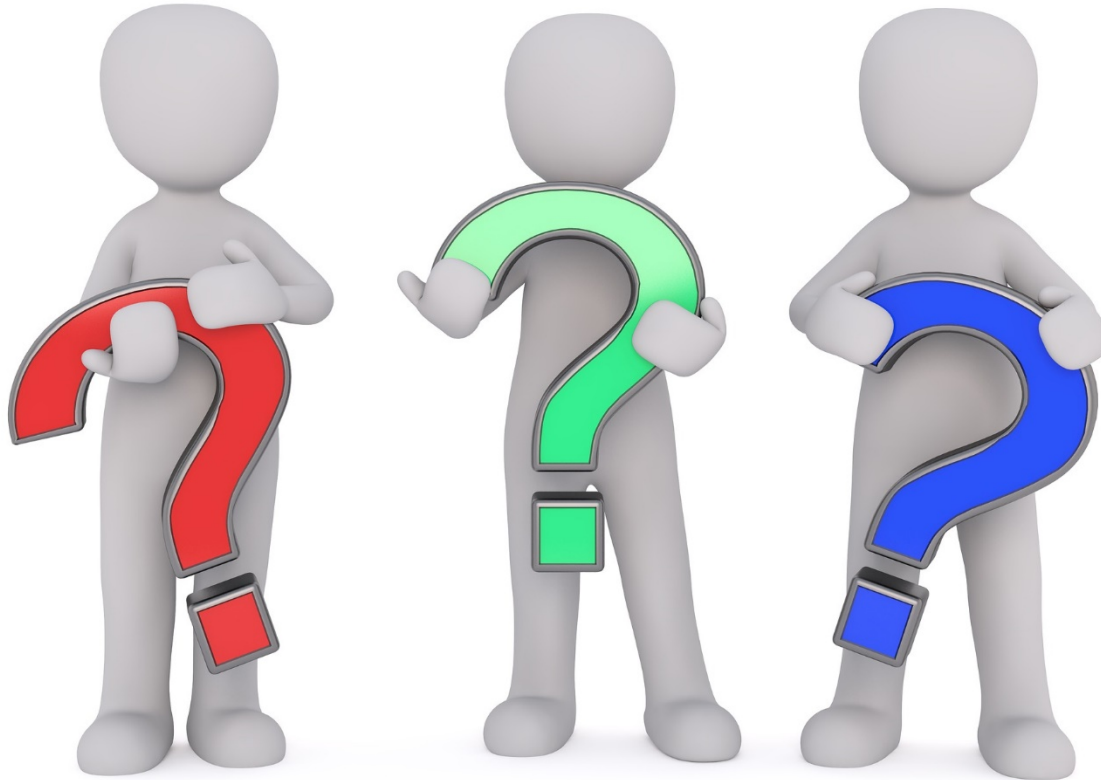
