WHAT ARE SERVICES?

Services are a subset of all the activities that the MEP provides through its programs and projects. Services are those educational or educationally related activities that:


- 1. directly benefit a migratory child;
- 2. address a need of a migratory child consistent with the SEA's comprehensive needs assessment and service delivery plan;
- 3. are grounded in scientifically based (evidence-based) research or, in the case of support services, are a generally accepted practice; and
- 4. are designed to enable the program to meet its measurable outcomes and contribute to the achievement of the State's performance targets.

WHAT ARE ALLOWABLE ACTIVITIES THAT ARE NOT SERVICES?

Examples of allowable activities that are <u>not</u> services are activities related to:


- Identification and recruitment
- Parental involvement
- Program evaluation
- Professional development
- Administration of the programs
- Handing out leaflets to migratory families on available reading programs as part of an effort to increase the reading skills of migratory children

Support Services

Codes	Guidelines
106	Use this code when technology is provided to support the student's academic progress. This can include laptops, electronic translators, e-readers, instructional or language development software, Brain Child, Leap Frog, ipods, kindles, etc.
107	Use this code when materials not recorded under 106 are provided to the student. This includes such materials as books, consumable supplies, etc.
109	Use this code for all advocacy services provided to ensure child is receiving all appropriate school-based services. This includes actions taken to ensure child is receiving free/reduced lunch, tutoring, remediation, accommodations, etc., and meetings with teachers and school personnel regarding child's progress and necessary supports (including EL). Must include a description.
110	Use this code when any type of early childhood support s given in or delivered to the home. This includes delivery of instructional materials or supplies and/or resource materials, evaluation of developmental milestones, etc.
111	Use this code when EL translation services are provided to the family or child. This includes in-class translation services.
113	Use this code when the MEP funds are used to pay test fees (i.e. HiSET fees) or to pay fees for instructional programs, including summer school or credit recovery or accrual programs.
118	The Federal reporting guidance defines this as "services to better identify and enhance [child's] educational, personal, or occupational potential." It can also include services to help child address "life problems or personal crisis that result from the culture of migrancy". Services can take place with counselors, peers, and other appropriate staff members.
120	Use when any of these services (vision, dental, nutrition, etc.) are provided to the student. This should be used only when support services are paid for with Migrant funds (e.g. glasses, hygiene kit, etc.)
122	Use when transportation services are provided to either the family or the child.
126	Use this code when student was referred to and received an educational, educationally, or health related non-migrant funded service they would not have otherwise received without efforts supported by MEP. Use start and end date of received service. Must provide a description.
127	Use this code when providing support to district COVID related efforts, including such activities as distribution of meals, providing families with COVID related information, distributing technology.
132	Use this code when providing a MEP funded or sponsored family instructional program or event. Must include a description of the service. (wording change: from "Literacy" to "Instructional 01/12/23)



Summer Camp Programs from LPB






